

Creating a Covid-19 Secure Stadium



This document sets out guidance on how to work, operate and participate in Football (with Fans) while minimising the risk of spreading COVID-19.

Introduction

The document is based on the current advice as of Monday 20th July 2020 and subject to change. The information in this document should be made readily available to all members of staff, playing or otherwise, bar staff, volunteers, visiting teams, match officials, volunteers, and spectators.

The guidance in this document is derived from advice across a multitude of agencies, including but not limited to, The UK Government, The Football Association and Sport England.

Although some sections of this document may not have a direct impact on your role it is imperative to read the full document as **EVERYONE HAS A PART TO PLAY TO ENSURE WE REMAIN COVID SECURE.**

Before Reopening

Risk assessment 1.0

Objective: To make sure that area of the stadium areas of the stadium are clean

and ready to operate.

Recommendation: Prior to allowing spectators back into the stadium all areas are sprayed by

the Club using Ramsol Sanitizer This spray is proven to kill coronavirus within five minutes (EN14476). It is food safe (EN1650) as well as proven to kill

bacteria (EN1276).

Further mitigation It is recommended that as well as spraying all contact points and indoor

spaces prior to opening that the changing rooms, hospitality suite etc are

sprayed once the first half as commenced.

Access to Stadium for Spectators

Risk assessment 1.6 & 1.7

Objective: To limit the contact point upon entering the stadium and ensure this is done in

a well-ventilated area.

Recommendation: All spectators access the stadium via Gate 1 or Gate 5. Entry is upon the

following conditions.

• Ticket purchased online to support track and trace.

 All spectators asked to read and confirm they are negative all aspects of self-screen.

Must sanitise hands upon entry.

Further mitigation It is recommended that all spectators have a face mask upon their person for

use with indoor spaces such as the toilets.

Managing Capacity

Risk assessment 1.8

Objective: To ensure distancing is possible by limiting the number of spectator's access

to the stadium.

Recommendation: Capacity capped using the minimum viable numbers based on the stadium

sports authority (method 2) of seating.

Further mitigation Spectators encouraged to, where possible, make use of the terrace space as

opposed to the main stand.

Moving in, out and through the stadium

Risk assessment 1.9

Objective: To ensure distancing is possible by limiting the number of spectator's access

to the stadium.

Recommendation: Stadium split into coloured sections with access limited into each

Further mitigation Lounge guests to access the stadium by exciting via the 1881 door and using

Gate 3 to access their seats.

Only limited and selected staff allowed access to the tunnel area and lounge.

Supporting Test and Trace

Risk assessment 2.0

Objective: To assist the Test and Trace service by keeping a temporary record of all staff

and customers.

Recommendation: Access to the stadium for everyone (Staff, players, volunteers and match

officials) is done via online ticketing system.

Further mitigation No ticket sales beyond 1400 Saturday and 1800 midweek.

Children within the stadium

Risk assessment 2.1

Objective: To ensure distancing of spectators and children within the stadium.

Recommendation: Stewards to pay attention to the movement of unsupervised children between

12-17 years old.

Further mitigation Any Children who fail follow guidance after a holistic approach to educating

them shall be removed and a ban considered.

Tunnel / Changing Room Ventilation

Risk assessment 2.2

Objective: To increase tunnel and changing room ventilation.

Recommendation: Install two Sealey VEN250 Portable Ventilators. These are ideal when high

volume of air is required.

Players, officials, and Staff Equipment

Risk assessment 2.3, 2.4

Objective: To reduce the risk of cross contamination with equipment.

Recommendation: Players and officials to bring their own labelled water bottled. Cones and balls

to be sprayed using Ramsol prior to use.

Match balls to be sprayed prior to match and spread around the vicinity

playing area,

Further Mitigation Any match balls that leave the playing area into the spectators is not reused

until cleaned.

Hand Hygiene

Risk assessment 2.7

Objective: To increase the awareness of importance of good

hand hygiene.

Recommendation: Twenty hand sanitizer units will be installed around

the stadium indoors and out. Condition of entry to sanitise hands at entry

point.

Further Mitigation Signage to encourage hand washing and a guide on how best to do it

displayed at every sink within the stadium. Hand Sanitizer stations located

near touch points.

Use of Outside Toilets

Risk assessment 2.8

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading of COVID-19 within the bathrooms.

Recommendation: Larger outside bathrooms limited to 2 or 3. Stewards to manage a queuing

system.

Further Mitigation Signage to encourage hand washing and a guide on how best to do it

displayed at every sink within the stadium. Hand Sanitizer stations located near all touch points. Toilets to be sprayed with Ramsol after kicking off in

preparation for high footfall at half time.

It is recommended that all spectators wear a face covering inside the toilets.

Use of Chewing Gum

Risk assessment 2.9

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 by gum being spat out or disposed

of in bins.

Recommendation: A complete ban on chewing gum.

Use of Chewing Gum

Risk assessment 3.0

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 by spitting sylvia.

Recommendation: A complete ban on spitting by all stadium entrants. Stewards to manage

spectators. Match officials asked to monitor and encourage players to avoid

spitting on the field of play.

Treatment of Injuries (Inside)

Risk assessment 3.1

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 between medical practitioners and

participants.

Recommendation: Only one player permitted to access the physio room at any one time. Player

to wear a face covering. Medical practitioners to wear visor, gloves, mask

and disposable apron.

Further Mitigation: Manual therapies (massage) to be banned until guidance allows.

Treatment of Injuries (Field of Play)

Risk assessment 3.2

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 between medical practitioners and

participants.

Recommendation: Medical Practitioner to wear gloves, disposable apron and face mask whilst

treating players.

Further Mitigation: Manual therapies (massage) to be banned until guidance allows.


Technical Areas

Risk assessment 3.3

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 in the technical areas.

Recommendation: Only 4 occupants per technical area. Each Club to decide who these are.

Further Mitigation: Seats marked with green ticks for those to be used.



Seating of substitutes and Club Staff

Risk assessment 3.4

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 in the seated area.

Recommendation: Area of 56 seats marked off in section C of the main stand. This area is to


host Home team substitutes and club staff only. Seating to be marked using the Stadium Safety authority guidelines, Maximum seating capacity in the

area is 20.

A similar area will be marked off for visiting substitutes, staff and Directors in Section D of the main stand. This area will consist of 70 Seats with maximum

seas to be used in the area is 26.

Further Mitigation: Seats marked with green ticks for those to be used.



Use of Press Box

Risk assessment 3.5

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 in the press box.

Recommendation: Maximum number of 4 only within this area. To consist of Home Club staff

only. Seats that can be used marked with Green ticks.

Additional Press Seating

Risk assessment 3.6

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 in the press box.

Recommendation: An area of 70 seats to be reserved for media. These seats for use will be

marked with Green ticks to state they can be used. Maximum use of 25.

Substitute warm up areas

Risk assessment 3.7

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 during warm up.

Recommendation: To make a request to the League and Football Association that allow

substitutes to warm up as follows:

Home team - To warm up behind Assistant Referee 1

Away team - To warm up opposite Assistant Referee 2

Risk assessment 3.8

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19.

Recommendation: To access the field of play by utilising any pitch gate other than the tunnel

pitch gate. Access to the main stand if required to be done using the steps

either end of the main stand

Payment of Match Officials

Risk assessment 3.9

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 by not using cash.

Recommendation: Match officials submit fees and expenses the day before match. These are

processed on a Monday for Saturday matches and Wednesday for Tuesday

matches.

As a business account we are unable to make weekend same day

transactions.

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Match Officials Pre-Match Meeting

Risk assessment 4.0

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 by moving meetings to an outdoor

space.

Recommendation: In dry warm weather this meeting should take place on the pitch as a time

agreed with the match officials.

In wet weather this should take place in the main stand.

Match officials room

Risk assessment 4.1

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 by ensuring match officials are kept

separate as far as possible from payers.

Recommendation: Match officials' room to be relocated to the manager's office with signage

added to remove boots prior to going up the stairs.

Post Match Food

Risk assessment 4.2

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 by ensuring players and staff do not

enter the lounge.

Recommendation: Post match pizza's will be delivered to the referee's room and both changing

rooms. This food must be consumed in the changing room or taken out of the

stadium.

Boardroom

Risk assessment 4.3

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading Covid-19 by closing the boardroom. (FA

Guidance)

Recommendation: To close the boardroom and have this space used by the manager and

coaching staff pre match. Spray upon starting the match at which point the dishwater can utilised. Anyone in this space should wear a facecovering.

Post-Match Media Interviews

Risk assessment 4.4

Objective: To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 that interviews do not take place

indoors.

Recommendation: A media space to be used for Home Manager interviews will be set up at the

rear of the main stand. A similar space will be set up for the away team.
